

THE CLUB IN A NUTSHELL

The Paris 16th district Table-Tennis Club, TT16, was founded in November 2008 by Nicolas BROCARD* and Michel GROZINGER**: two highly qualified and experienced coaches. It targets a wide audience, from "7 to 77 years old" and aims at training all passionate players: adults, young people, competitors, sports lovers.

The club offers both group and individual training at Lycée Jean de la Fontaine with access to 10 tables and two gym facilities.

QUICK FACTS ABOUT THE ULTIMATE

15 years ago, Germany promoted a booming sport with more than 50,000 Ultimate Ping players, a derivative of table tennis:

- The size of the playing area around the table (nearly 130 m²) makes it possible to extend the exchanges while keeping the explosive side of the small ball: an exchange of up to 50 shots.
- The services are rather similar to that of tennis: the best ones can reach 160 km/h
- High-level competitions can last more than an hour: a real show with competition adrenaline!

SHARED VALUES

The TT16 founders' ambition and commitment to this innovative sport have inspired LexiFi to join the Ultimate Ping journey as a sponsor and a privileged partner of the club.

The club had been working for 6 years since its creation (in 2008) towards the construction of a dedicated gym. TT16 finally won -among 2500 applicants- a funding competition organized by the Parisian municipality. The construction work is expected to end by June 2021.

Moreover, the Ultimate Ping France association and LexiFi share a common **European vision** driven by the company's founder, Jean-Marc EBER, who is of Franco-German origin. The Ultimate Ping France has established close links with the German Ultimate Ping leaders and aims at developing this sport **at an international level**.

LexiFi values the club's emphasis on **the promotion of equal opportunities** between women and men as well as players from different ages and backgrounds.
